4. Your proxy may vote as he or she chooses on any resolution for which you do not give an instruction and on any amended resolutions or other procedural issues that might arise at the meeting.
5. The “vote withheld” option is provided to enable you to abstain on any particular resolution. However, it should be noted that a “vote withheld” is not a vote in law and will not be counted in the calculation of the proportion of votes “for” and “against” a resolution.
6. **The appointment of a proxy does not prevent members from subsequently attending the meeting in person and voting.**
